Who should attend?

Course Aims & Objectives

Certification

Delegates are awarded the official NEBOSH Certificate in Fire Safety on successful completion and passing of the NEBOSH exam and practical fire risk assessment.

Duration

5 days training followed by an open book exam (Candidates have 24-hours to compete this - though you should be able to complete it in 4-5 hours.).

Candidates also need to conduct a risk assessment based practical application in their own workplace.

Please note there will be approximately 20 hours of private study required.
